- IV. Review zoning Discussion of Townhomes & Apartments edited into Chapter 66  

Chart was inserted into the code, Scott Lobdel stated that the chart doesn't properly address the town homes setbacks. Changes were provided that will be reflected in an update to the chart for review at the next meeting. PC is insisting that there will be no on street parking allowed. Engineer suggested that there are at least 2 parking spaces minimum. More concern about impervious coverage per the engineer. PC is still insisting that code must state the parking is not on the street. Code should include all the details with examples of how the properties should appear to match the older style of the community. Sheryl will share the email with the rest of the commissioners. We will review the maps to find the correct placement of the new zones. Current commercial zone does allow business on the lower level and apartments above. Mixed use is another area the PC should discuss. May want to look into rezoning areas in the downtown area.

We will need to have a public hearing regarding rezoning and code changes. Notification needs to be 15 days prior to the hearing. Then recommendations to council can be made and then council will have the solicitor review and vote at the council level.

- V. Town's response to the Southern New Castle County Master Plan  
Draft plan has been created and available for review. Town Manager is concerned that NCC has drastically limited the development below Middletown. Both the Town Manager and Mayor have provided comment to the 3 scenarios and both requested a 4<sup>th</sup> scenario to allow for development & access to sewer in our area. People are coming here for schools, leave to get jobs, return to retire. NCC has not planned for what happens to agricultural area when the farmers no longer want to farm. There should be a plan for farmland below Middletown and Townsend has access to the railroad that runs through town. Approximately 50,000 residents live in unincorporated areas and they will want to move into areas that can provide services like sewer.

Preservations timeframe is running out. NCC can buy the land when the preservation runs out. County has no money so the landowners can sell to developers. Sewer agreement runs out in 2026. Mayor wants either NCC to provide more sewer, get it from Middletown or from the south.

Routh 15, Wiggins Mill Road, Main Street are all being used by heavy industrial and commercial vehicles. Also increased traffic due to all the commercial development in Middletown along Hwy 301.

Town is meeting with NCC Public works. They are also meeting on the 24<sup>th</sup> at 11am as a Public Meeting regarding the Southern NCC Master Plan is for 30 years. PC members are invited to attend the meeting. Page 33 of the Comp Plan states that we need sewer. Link to plan can be found on WilMapco. No roadways and infrastructure will be improved if it's not in the master plan.

We need to hold special workshops to continue to review the entire code and not just add townhomes and move on. Emily will take charge of updating the document. Workshop meetings will be held Jan. 30<sup>th</sup> 7:00pm-8:30pm and also Feb. 1<sup>st</sup> 9:00am-Noon.
