- I. Call to Order: 5:07 pm
- II. Opening Ceremonies

IV. Adoption of Agenda.

- a. CW Rojas adopted agenda and stated she wants to hold the meeting informally with respect to motions and voting.

V. Discussion to finalize plan for Trunk or Treat and Pumpkin Patch

- a. CW Rojas stated the setup time for the Town's Pumpkin Patch will be at 5:45 pm. TM Tantillo noted that GFL, the Town's municipal waste provider, will be dropping off a Halloween sign for the Pumpkins that they have donated for this event.

She explained that the Town will only need to show up and advise the staff present who they are, and the staff will know where to have the Town setup. TM Tantillo confirmed there is enough supplies and goodies for the event. Additionally, she will provide schoolbooks and the Townsend Train Station photo for the setup.

- b. TM Tantillo stated that Santa needs a new suit since he has outgrown it. CW Rojas advised she will speak with her husband regarding this since he knows Santa very well.
- c. TM Tantillo stated she is looking to add ornaments to the Town's collection and noted this has been the Town's tradition to make the tree even brighter each year.
- d. Chief Longo recommended for the screen to be displayed behind where Santa will be sitting so the backdrop can be presented and when the Caroling begins the backdrop can change to lyrics so carolers can sing along. TM Tantillo advised logistics of the event can be looked at later. TM Tantillo stated there are still some gifts left from last year that can be given out this year. TM Tantillo advised more candy canes will be needed for this year.
- e. TM Tantillo stated she is waiting for approval to her request that was sent to Toys 4 Tots so that it may be announced at the event that the Town will be taking donations. CW Rojas advised she will provide the bins for this and when the event approaches, she can decorate the bins to look like gift boxes. TM Tantillo advised that Toys 4 Tots may already be providing bins, but this will be a great addition.

IX. Adjourn

- a. CW Rojas gave a brief update on the following upcoming events that will need to be discussed further at the upcoming meetings:
 - 1. CW Rojas stated she will be emailing Odessa High School and Appoquinimink School District with the Mural Contest design and instructions. She will also be bringing the physical copies to Middletown High School to see if they are interested in participating in this contest. CW Rojas stated she is looking to have all the entries by the December Council Meeting and advised that the Town will need to look into purchasing supplies for the mural.
 - 2. TM Tantillo stated the Town has partnered with the DVSA for the food drive and that the DVSA will be dropping of a bin and sign. Additionally, she stated that this should be posted next week but is waiting for DVSA to provide the dates and a list of needs. CW Rojas advised for the Townsend Sign in front of Townhall to be changed intermittently for the upcoming drives and events that will be occurring.
 - 3. TM Tantillo announced that the Town is also holding a drive for the Three Palms Zoo that will be running from 12/12 to 12/21. CW Rojas offered to assist with picking up and delivery of the bins.
 - 4. TM Tantillo explained the process of last year's Holiday Light Contest. TM Tantillo stated Mayor Lobdell and a few other Council Members volunteered to drive in December to gather photos or videos so they can be sent to all members of Council. TM Tantillo explained that Council will then provide feedback by the first Wednesday of January. CW Rojas stated for this year it would be best to have judging happen before Christmas so that winners can be announced on Christmas. TM Tantillo stated she will check the award amounts that were given for the winner last year and will update last year's flyer with this year's information.
