Monarch Pledge 2023

Mayor Scott Lobdell signed the Mayor's Monarch Pledge on February 1, 2023, reaffirming the Town's commitment to protect the Monarch Butterfly and encouraging other city officials to take a stand with him so that the monarch butterfly will once again flourish across the continent.

Monarchs cannot survive without milkweed. The caterpillar will only eat milkweed plants and the butterfly lays their eggs on milkweed. Please plant milkweed to support monarch populations, and their incredible migration! Planting milkweed is a great way to help other pollinators too, as they provide valuable nectar resources to a diverse suite of bees and butterflies.

Town Council Candidates

There are four (4) Council positions up for election this year. Three of the positions are for a two-year term. One position is for a one-year term. To be eligible for candidacy you must meet the following qualifications:

- Be 18 years of age
- Be a Citizen of the United States of America
- Be a registered voter in the State of Delaware, New Castle County
- Be a legal resident within the Town Corporate Boundaries for a minimum of twelve (12) consecutive months immediately preceding the filing of candidacy.

Petitions of Candidacy may be requested by contacting Town Hall at 302-378-8082, sending an email to townhall@townsend.delaware.gov, or picking up a packet in person.

All applications must be received at Town Hall by 4:30 pm on Tuesday, March 28th, 2023.

2023 Waste Contract Approved by Council

GFL Environmental will remain the trash service provider through June 30th, 2026. Trash containers must be curbside no later than 7 am on the scheduled pick-up day. Place the carts with the handles facing the house. **BAG ALL TRASH**. Please remember that your recycling should **NOT BE BAGGED** and breakdown any large cardboard boxes.

Yard Waste will continue to be collected bi-weekly on the same day that the trash is collected. **Please do not bag yard waste.** GFL will take small bundles of branches and twigs that are tied with twine. Collection will begin in April and runs until the end of December.

Also, one free bulk pick-up is included per address every week. You must call GFL directly to schedule your collection- 302-378-5400 or call Town Hall at 302-378-8082 to make arrangements.

Your Townsend Police Chief Speaks Up

Prevent bicycle theft

- Keep your bike, mower, and other items you value in a locked garage. Be sure to lock your bicycle to a stationary object and make sure both wheels are locked. Remove any accessories that can easily be taken.
- Record the makes, models, serial numbers, and descriptions and keep this information in a safe place.

Playground Safety Tips

- Actively supervise children on playgrounds and check the area where play occurs.
- Teach children that pushing, shoving, or crowding while on the playground can be dangerous. Remember, little kids can play differently than big kids.
- Bikes, skates, and scooters Remember helmets and pads! Ensure that kids have a safe, vehicle-free area to ride and that they follow the manufacturer's guidelines for equipment (especially age recommendations)

Yard security

- If you're working in the front yard, lock the back door and garage and vice versa when in the back yard.
- Don't keep ladders or other equipment in the yard that could be used to gain access to your home.
- Keep shrubs, bushes, hedges, and fences to a height of three feet or less.
- Residential lighting should be used to light up home entry points. Motion detector lights are great deterrents.

In the home

- Use pins to hold curtain in place which allows windows to be open for ventilation but prevent them from being opened too wide.
- Don't advertise your vacation plans. Ask a trusted neighbor to pick up the mail and papers and to cut grass.
- Use light timers which will turn two or more lights on and off at predetermined times, like normal activity. The living room and one bedroom are good choices.
- Lock your doors, even if you are leaving only for a short time. For vulnerable sliding doors, add extra protection with a bar, track lock or slide bolt.
- Conduct a home inventory to record the serial numbers and other important details of your valuables. This information can help with recovery.

Vehicle safety

- Park your vehicle in well lighted or supervised/patrolled places.
- Never leave anything of value in your vehicle. Coins, sunglasses, and cords may be a target for a thief.
- Take your garage door opener inside with you if you park on the street to prevent a car break-in leading to a home break-in.

Public Works

The painting of the curbs in front of the fire hydrants will begin again as the weather is improving.

The Fire Chief has identified public safety areas throughout roads in the subdivisions. The Public Safety Committee is reviewing the areas of concern and affected homeowners will receive a letter from the Town detailing the areas of concern and the streets where residents and visitors should be mindful of parking. The building of a pole barn for use by Public Works has been placed on hold until June. A concept site plan had been drafted to place the building at 661 South Street, but the Town Manager and Town Engineer are exploring locations throughout Town for this building.

Blowing Trash

Residents, please confirm that your trash and recycling bins are securely closed especially if setting out your cans on Sunday evening. If you see trash on the roadways, yards, and common areas, please collect any materials and place them in the proper can.

Residents Curb your Dogs

Dog owners, please have your pet relieve themselves in the easement area between the curb and the sidewalk. This is not the owner's yard. Make sure to pick-up your dog waste and dispose of properly. Residents, if you see someone who does not clean up after their pet, please file a complaint with the Town and they will attempt to locate the owner and fine them \$50 per incident.

Annexation of Property into Town

Townsend Police Report

From January 1- January 26th, our police force handled a total of 12 calls and conducted 9 school traffic details. There are currently three ongoing criminal investigations within Town. The Delaware State Police handled 14 calls in Town when our force was not available.

For the month of February, our force handled 10 calls and conducted 7 school traffic details. The Delaware State Police handled 12 calls in Town when our force was not available.

Our PD continues to build a relationship with our Townsend Fire Company. Our officers participated in dive training/practice with the Townsend Fire Company.
