**WHEREAS**, every citizen of Townsend can make a difference for the monarch by planting native milkweed and nectar plants to provide habitat for the monarch and pollinators in locations where people live, work, learn, play and worship; and

**WHEREAS**, on behalf of the people of Townsend who have already joined me in creating healthy habitat for these magnificent butterflies, I am honored to lead the way by signing the 2024 National Wildlife Federation's Mayors' Monarch Pledge; and

**WHEREAS**, I encourage other city officials across our great nation to take a stand with me so that the monarch butterfly will once again flourish across the content.

Now, therefore, I, Scott Lobdell, Mayor of the Town of Townsend, do hereby proclaim February 7<sup>th</sup>, 2024, as: "**MAYORS' MONARCH PLEDGE DAY**" in the Town of Townsend.
