RESOLUTION **2025-013**

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING BUDGET AMENDMENTS TO THE FY2025 MUNICIPAL BUDGET

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Townsend, Delaware, adopted a balanced Fiscal Year 2025 Municipal Budget to provide for the general operations, maintenance, and capital needs of the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Townsend periodically receives grant funds and other external funding sources to support various projects and initiatives that align with the Town's strategic priorities; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary from time to time to amend the adopted budget to accurately reflect such new revenues and expenditures, ensuring proper accounting and transparency in the Town's financial management; and

WHEREAS, Town Council recognizes that amending the budget to incorporate these funds and adjustments ensures that all resources are properly accounted for and utilized for the benefit of the community; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council finds that it is in the best interest of the Town of Townsend and its residents to approve these budget amendments for the purposes described herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Townsend, Delaware, that the FY2025 Municipal Budget is hereby amended as follows:

• Surface Water Project Funding

 Increase the Budget by \$50,000 to include Surface Water Grant funding to match existing ARPA funds previously allocated for the Town's Surface Water Improvement Project.

Cyber Grant Funding

 Increase the Budget by \$29,100.00 to include Cyber Grant funding for Computer and Software expenses to strengthen municipal technology and cybersecurity.

• Public Works Capital Equipment Adjustment

 Reallocate \$800 from Town Hall Expenses to Capital Expenses for the purchase of a Salt Spreader for the Public Works Department.

• Smaller Park Revitalization Grant

 Increase the Budget by \$2,000 to recognize grant funding received through Councilmember Dave Carter for the Smaller Park Revitalization Project.

• Police Budget Adjustment

Reallocate \$100 from Police payroll expenses to Police Miscellaneous expenses for the Ground Breaking Ceremony of new Police Building.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Manager and Finance Officer are hereby authorized and directed to make the necessary accounting adjustments to reflect this transfer.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by Town Council.

RE: Recommendation for Annexation and Zoning Classification – 6073 Summit Bridge Road

To the Mayor and Town Council,

Mrs. Elizabeth Chapman At its duly noticed meeting held on October 15th, 2025, the Townsend Planning Commission reviewed the application for annexation of the property located at **6073 Summit Bridge Road**, identified as Tax Parcel [NCC Parcel #1401600066].

Mr. Januarius Asongu Following review and discussion, the Planning Commission voted to recommend approval of the annexation of the subject property into the Town of Townsend.

Ms. Eschalla Clarke

In conjunction with this recommendation, the Planning Commission further recommends that upon annexation, the property be **zoned (C) Commercial**, consistent with the Town's Comprehensive Plan and surrounding land uses. The Commission finds that the proposed zoning classification aligns with the intended use of the property, supports economic development goals, and maintains compatibility with adjacent properties.

We respectfully forward this recommendation to Town Council for consideration and action.
